ABSTRACT

An abstract is a single paragraph without subheadings, indentations, or references. It should be an explicit summary of your research that states the problem, the objectives, the methodology, the major results, and the conclusions. It should be single-spaced in 11-point Times New Roman font. Do not include bullets/lists or references in the abstract. The first part of your abstract should state the problem or issue you set out to solve and explain your rationale for pursuing the research. The purpose of your study is to solve this problem and/or add to your discipline's understanding of the issue. Your abstract should also describe the research methods. Next, your abstract should indicate the results or outcomes of the work you have done so far. Finally, your abstract should close with a statement of the project's implications and contributions to its field. The content of the abstract will be the basis for acceptance of the poster presentation at the 2023 Gender Summit. The top 10 abstract presentations will be given the opportunity to have a 3-minute oral presentation at the summit. Certificates will be issued to only presenting authors for successful abstracts. All accepted abstracts will be published in the Book of Abstracts. The abstracts will be peerreviewed and authors will be informed about acceptance for presentation via email. Be sure to adhere to the word limitation for the abstract (Minimum-300 words, Maximum-350 words), Ensure that your abstract accurately represents the content of your work. Use precise language to describe methodology, results, and conclusions. Edit your abstract for grammar, spelling, and punctuation errors. Check sentence structure and coherence. The abstract should be submitted in the format of portable document format (pdf). Keywords should be given a one-line space below this text.
